## Campus Information

**OUR SCHOOL:** Noble and Greenough School is a nonsectarian, coeducational day and 5-day boarding school for grades 7-12. Nobles is a rigorous academic community dedicated to inspiring leadership for the public good. Through mentoring relationships, we motivate students to achieve their highest potential and to lead lives characterized by service to others.

**OUR COMMUNITY:** Nobles teaches students to uphold the foundational principles of honesty, respect for self and respect for others. Through these principles, Nobles cultivates character and intellect together. We maintain that diversity in our community generates critical, creative and socially-conscious thinkers.
