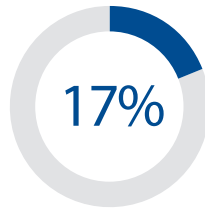

Nobles' Response to Covid-19

All Spring 2020 courses were graded Pass/Fail.

From March-June 2020, Virtual Nobles allowed us to teach and learn remotely. For the duration of the 2020-2021 academic year, Nobles operated in a hybrid model with all students learning in person 2-3 days per week, and participating in Virtual Nobles on the other days. 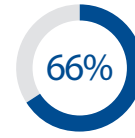
